

SOME THOUGHTS ON TODAY'S GOSPEL

y love for others must not be conditioned by how they respond. Jesus loves me totally, whether I am good or bad or indifferent. My love must have that quality too. This is costly love - it could demand my very life!

esus wants above all to reassure his friends of his love which, as they will soon see, cannot be greater. I realise that these words are also addressed to me, in all my weakness and uncertainty. I ask for God's help that my love will be like that of Jesus, that I may be ready to give myself for others.

The core of the Christian message is love. God loves me! If we could grasp God's unconditional love for us, life would be a journey of joy. To accept that God loves me is also to accept the reality that God loves all others in the same way. I am called to love myself and others, and it is clear from the Gospel that I am called to love the poor, the excluded, and the marginalised in a special way. I am also called to care for the earth, described by Pope Francis as "our common home"; which God has entrusted us.

God, who calls us to generous commitment and to give him our all, offers us the light and the strength needed to continue on our way. In the heart of this world, the Lord of life, who loves us so much, is always present. He does not abandon us, he does not leave us alone, for he has united himself definitively to our earth, and his love constantly impels us to find new ways forward. (Pope Francis, Laudato Si 245).
