# **CHILDREN'S CHATTER MATTERS**

3. After reading a book with your child, play a guessing game to see how well they were listening and comprehending. Choose a character, place or time from the book and provide clues for your child to guess. For example, I wore a mask, I crept into the house at night and I was scared of the dog = the robber.

4. When there is dialogue/talking marks in the book, add a special voice for the character. If the dialogue is repetitive, get your child to be the part. If the book does not have any dialogue, ask your child what they think the character would be saying.

#### FROM FR TONY

Alot of you would remember the film, "Dead Poets' Society" that starred the late Robyn Williams. If you've never seen it, it's worth looking at. It's basically the story of a teacher who comes to an English private school with fresh ideas, and makes the lads think about things in a new way. The advertisement that came out ahead of the release of the film was, "he made their ordinary lives extraordinary."

I often quote something from a Russian writer named Feodor Dostoevsky that I found years ago. I don't know much about him, but I like his words about Jesus. It goes simply, "I believe there is no one lovelier, deeper, more sympathetic and more perfect than Jesus. I say to myself that not only is there no one else like him, but there could never be one like him.

Another great spiritual writer was Sebastian Moore who was one of the most outspoken and brilliant religious thinkers of the later twentieth century. His life as a monk at the Benedictine Abbey of Downside in England was changed decisively when he became a parish priest in a deprived Liverpool city parish in the 1960s and his refusal to return in 1970 led to an academic career in the United States,

There he published some of his most significant work on human desire and Christian spirituality. Among many things he wrote was a little gem that goes, "I get more and more from the Gospels that people, in comparison with Christ, are only half alive. Christ is life itself, hammering on the tombs in which our souls lie buried,"

Reading things like this make me want to explain who Jesus is to me.

I think for me that Jesus is the one who makes my ordinary life extraordinary.

The question Jesus puts to his disciples in today's Gospel is asked of each one of us - WHO DO YOU SAY THAT I AM?

It is not just once - but continually. It is meant to inform the response of our entire life. How we answer that question determines who we will become and how we live. It is a question which cannot be answered indirectly, or half-heartedly. It is not enough to rely on what some say. The question is profoundly personal as well as public. Who is Jesus Christ to ME?

Jesus is the One in whom all the promises of God find their fulfilment and response. He is the answer to every human question, the fulfilment of every authentic human need, the balm of healing for every human wound, the satisfaction of every authentic human desire, and the way to authentic human freedom and flourishing. He is the Christ, the Messiah, the One who saves us from sin and its effects and saves us for a new way of living, forever.

The word "Gospel" literally means "Good News". There is Good News! God has revealed Himself to us. He is not hidden. The word "revelation" literally means to "unveil", to make known. This is what has occurred, is occurring, and will occur in Jesus Christ. Jesus Christ is the Self-Revelation of God.

This God who fashioned the Universe is not simply a principle to be reflected upon, leading us to a set of propositions. He has been manifested, unveiled to us. The Living Word, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, has become one like us in all things but sin, so that we can be recreated anew and, by grace, become like Him.

This week, let's allow the Lord Jesus to make our ordinary lives extraordinary because, as Dostoevsky wrote, "there is no one lovelier, deeper, more sympathetic and more perfect than Jesus" and it is he whom we follow.
